The **New York City Firefighter Stair Climb** is a memorial climb focused on remembering those first responders who made the ultimate sacrifice on September 11, 2001 during the attacks on the Twin Towers.

Since its inception in 2015, the Climb has raised and donated over \$80,000

to charities that support victims, families, and military personal who have been affected by the events on 9/11.





On March 19, 343 firefighters based in New York City and from across the globe will come together and ascend the 72 stories of 4 World Trade Center as a memorial to those fallen first responders and military personnel worldwide.

Proceeds from the 2017 Climb will be donated to **Friends of Firefighters**, a non-profit organization dedicated to providing long-term physical, mental health and wellness support to New York City's firefighters and their families.
